ESPLER filed a complaint with the United States District Court on March 4th, 2015 challenging California's current anti-prostitution law, Penal Code 647(b) on the following grounds:

- These laws deprive individuals of the fundamental right to engage in consensual, private sexual activity.
- These laws deny individuals the right to choose for themselves how to earn a

living and who to enter into a contract with.

- These laws limit how and with whom an individual can associate in private.
- Enforcement of these laws discourages safe sex because the possession of condoms is used as evidence by prosecutors.
- California has failed to provide a legitimate rationale to continue denying

individuals the right of free speech, the right to earn a living, and the right to freely associate.

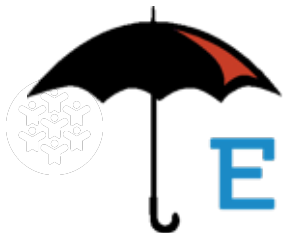
- The Penal Code is vaguely worded. It criminalizes the mere discussion of paying for erotic services between consenting adults. This violates our Constitutional Right of free speech, the right to earn a living, and the right to freely associate.
